To Whom It May Concern:

About the last thing most of us want to do is take a class detailing all the many rules OSHA/WISHA imposes on our practices. The OSHA/WISHA code is long, boring, and often seems like trivial bureaucracy intruding in our practice lives. In fact, it is nearly impossible to be one-hundred percent compliant, but Dr. Sam Barry will get you close.

We have been taking Dr. Barry's OSHA/WISHA classes for several years, and even though over time it may seem redundant, there's always something new to implement. We were extremely glad that we listened and implemented Sam's recommendations when, on the morning of January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2011, the OSHA/WISHA inspectors showed up at our office unannounced.

At the end of their visit, they approached my office manager, Angela, and told her that our office was nearly 100% compliant (*the only complaint was an unlabeled container of liquid destined for the trash*), and I immediately knew who I needed to thank for that: 1) Dr. Barry, who taught us OSHA/WISHA compliance; and 2) Angela, who keeps our office up to code with respect to OSHA/WISHA.

I unequivocally recommend Dr. Sam Barry as an OSHA/WISHA trainer and educator, as he has proven himself to me and my office. I never thought I'd face unscrupulous accusations. But, thanks to Dr. Barry, we came away from an inspection not only unscathed, but the inspectors complimented us on how well everything was organized, labeled, and in compliance. Dr. Barry also has the advantage as a trained dentist, he understands how to integrate the OSHA/WISHA concepts into practice. Least of all, but still important, Dr. Barry's course fee is a fraction of what others charge.
